Brief description/mission:

Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual and Transgender (LGBT) Affairs provides education, advocacy, and support for lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer, questioning, and straight-allied students, staff, and faculty at the University of Florida. What activities will the intern take part in, and how do they relate to Women's/Gender studies?

An intern in the LGBT Affairs office will be assigned a specific project based on their strengths, academic or personal interests, and the needs of the department. We are a volunteer-driven department, and our interns have the chance to do meaningful, direct service the majority of their experience in LGBT Affairs. Previous interns have planned and hosted conferences, created and presented educational materials, designed newsletters, planned awareness-raising events, and much more.
